Curriculum Map – Music

Intent

The Music curriculum is designed to ignite a lifelong passion for music, nurture creativity, and develop essential musical skills and understanding in every student. Rooted in the belief that music is a universal language that enriches lives and communities, our curriculum aims to provide students with a broad and diverse musical education that celebrates cultural diversity, fosters creativity, and promotes personal growth.

At TAA students are taken through a multitude of classical and contemporary areas of music genres and topics and explore the three strands of listening, composing and performing. Students learn to use their voices in unison, play ukeleles and keyboards in Y7 before moving onto more ensemble based rock/pop instruments in Y8-Y9 such as on guitar, bass, drums and world percussion. Additionally music technology is introduced in Y9 to broaden student's experience of modern styles via compositional tasks. For those that opt in Y10 for BTEC students will specialise in 2 pathways: Music Performance (Instrumental Study) and Music Production (Digital Audio Workstation DAW)
