What's the difference?

WHAT WILL I BE STUDYING?

All three sciences:

Biology, Chemistry, Physics

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HOW MANY LESSONS WILL I HAVE?

15 hours of teaching time every
two weeks - 5 hours of each
science

10 hours of teaching time every
two weeks - 3 hours of two
sciences, 4 of another

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

6 exams (two for each science)
each 1 hour 45 minutes

6 exams (two for each science)
each 1 hour 15 minutes

WHAT WILL I GET AT THE END?

3 GCSE's - separated out by each
science

2 GCSE's - an average of all six
exams sat

WHY DOES TRIPLE HAVE SO MANY MORE LESSONS?

There is some specific triple science only content for each of the three sciences, including: space, the brain and eye, and alcohols and esters.

If you're thinking about A-level sciences triple science will make it a lot easier!
