You will also have the option to complete a PGCE.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- ► GCSEs at grade 4 (C) or above in English and Maths*
- ➤ An undergraduate degree (relating to the subject you would like to teach)

If you are unsure about whether your qualifications meet this criteria, please contact us.

*If you do not have these GCSEs, you may be eligible for equivalency testing. Visit ctg.ac.uk/Equivalency-Testing/ for more information.

COURSES:

Our secondary courses equip you to teach your chosen age range with confidence. You'll gain in-depth knowledge of your specialist subject and develop the professional teaching skills essential for engaging and inspiring secondary students.

Per week, on average, you will spend 1 day at our training centre for expert-led training and 4 days in a school for hands-on teaching experience.

- Secondary Ages 11-16 | KS3 & KS4 Subjects: English, Maths, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, Geography, History, Music, Physical Education, Religious Education, Art & Design, D&T - Food Technology, D&T - Product Design, MFL Spanish, MFL French
- Secondary Ages 14 19 | KS4 & KS5 Subjects: Business Studies, Health and Social Care











ROUTES TO QTS:

► FEE-FUNDED

QTS Only.....£8535 OTS + PGCE.....£9535

This course runs for 38 weeks.

Assessment is on an ongoing basis through performance during school experience and through academic coursework.

On this route, the trainee will be required to fund the course themself or via student finance (see 'funding'). *Mentor payments available*.

► SALARIED

QTS Only.....£8535 PGCE.....£1000

(The PGCE element is self-funded by the trainee)

This route is for those who are already employed by a school. It runs for 38 weeks.

Trainees will be assessed on an ongoing basis through performance during school experience and through academic coursework.

The employing school will pay the trainee's salary. If the subject has a bursary, the school will receive this. In prior agreement with the school, the trainee may be asked to pay the full QTS fees. *Mentor payments available.*

▶ APPRENTICESHIP

QTS Only.....£9000 PGCE.....£1000

(The PGCE element is self-funded by the apprentice)

This route is for those who are already employed by a school. The course lasts for 4 terms. QTS is awarded in July and the End Point Assessment is Oct/Nov.

The employing school will pay the trainee a salary. QTS fees are paid by the school's apprenticeship levy and not by the trainee. If there is a bursary available for the chosen subject, the school will receive this and may use it to pay the trainee's salary. The trainee is employed by a school and is not a student, therefore cannot access student finance. No mentor payments are available.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT:

The UK government offers a range of financial support options to help trainees pay their tuition fees and living costs.

UK citizens can access a tuition fee loan of up to £9,535 per year and a maintenance loan of up to approximately £10,544 per year. These loans are repaid gradually, starting only when your income exceeds a specified threshold.

There are also bursaries of up to £29,000 available for those training in certain secondary subjects.

If you are a parent, have an adult dependent or a disability, you may be entitled to extra funding that does not have to be paid back. These include a childcare grant, the Parents' Learning Allowance, the Adult Dependants' Grant and the Disabled Students' Allowance.


